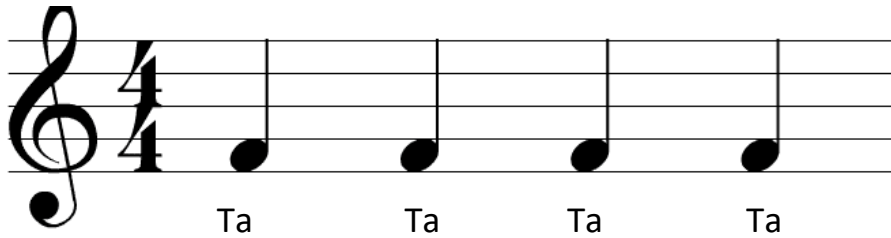


Let's Have Some Fun With Rhythms!!

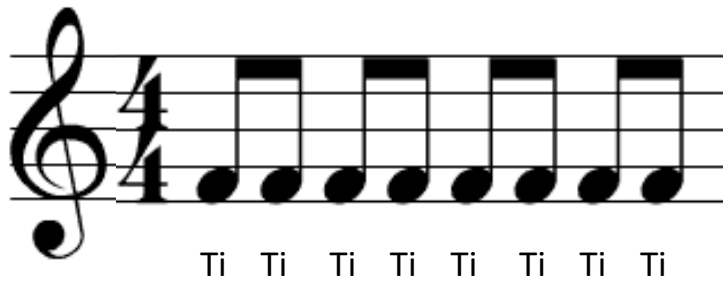
